

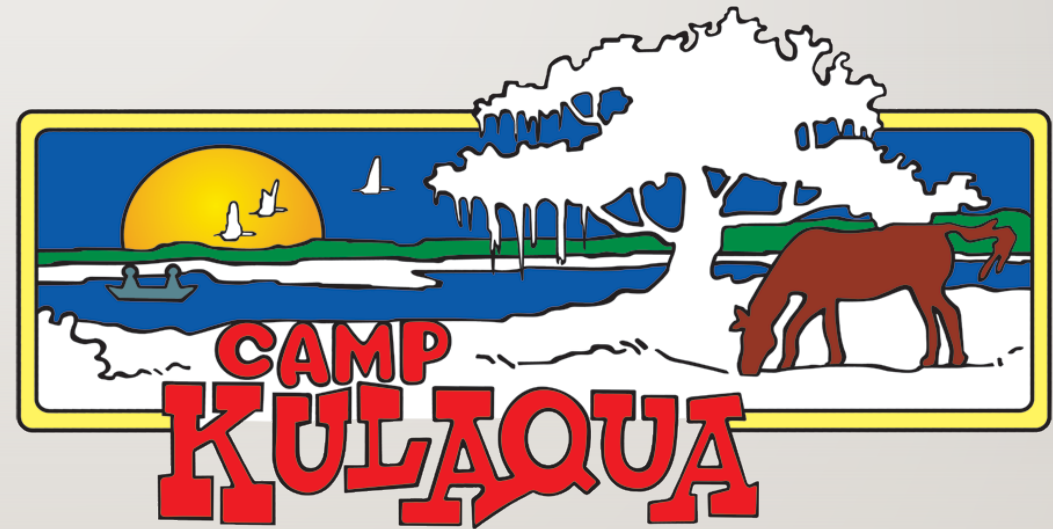
WHAT OUTDOOR ED LOOKS LIKE TODAY

DAILY SCREENINGS



DAILY OPERATIONS

Temperature checks each day for all attendees

Masks required inside buildings & at outdoor spaces where social distancing is not possible

Kulaqua staff are screened daily, and wear PPP when in contact with guests

Pre-screening of all attendees upon arrival to camp

Activities have sanitation procedures, queues spread out, and decreased capacities in all areas

CAFETERIA

- Buffet lines have been removed and a Cafeteria-serving line has been implemented
- Drink station is served by camp staff (concession style)
- Dining is spread out, with schools sitting in pods, & social distancing between other schools
- Cutlery kits in individual packets are provided at meals
- Our staff in contact with food prep & service wear a mask, gloves, and increased sanitation in the areas



LODGING

- Lodging ratios are reduced 1 chaperone per 5 students in each unit
 - Mini Lodges will have 6 upstairs and 6 downstairs, & separate entrances
 - Woodland Lodge adjoining rooms will have a total of 6 people in each combined unit
- Removal of bedspreads in all lodging where bedding is provided
- Kulaqua's housekeeping staff wear PPE when in contact with guest housing and meeting facilities

WHAT OUTDOOR EDUCATION WILL LOOK LIKE

- Reduced class sizes and limit school to school contact
- School groups are treated like “family groups” and paired together
- Camp Kulaqua Staff wear PPE at all times while in contact with students & teachers
- Markers in queue lines at activities with hand sanitizer at the locations
- Certain elements of camp may be removed where social distancing may not be possible, such as hayrides, large indoor group games & meetings
- Indoor classes will be limited and require masks to be worn at all times by all individuals
- Relaxed schedule to allow for additional sanitation and moving about
- Will require flexibility from schools in housing choices due to reduced capacities
- Smaller ratios, with 1 chaperone to 5 children
- The rules of the camp, including Covid-19 requirements, will be mandated
